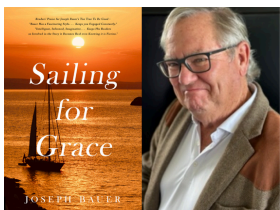


YALLFest Red Carpet Preview

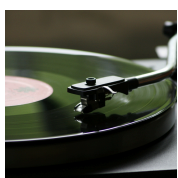


National Novel Writing Month: Quiet Time Writing

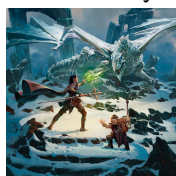


Simply Delicious: Slab Pie

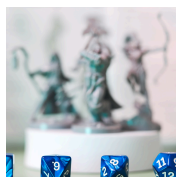
